William Bodine High School GOALS

The school has exceeded the baseline target (22.2%) for 18-19 in all three Keystone tested areas, however, there has been a decline in achievement on the Biology assessment (69.9% in 16-17 to 50.4% in 18-19). The school goal will be to meet or exceed the school district goal of 52% by or before August 2026.

School Plan Priorities:

1. Implement a multi-tiered system of support for academics and behavior in order to address individual student learning needs.

2.Build leadership capacity and empower staff/students in the development and successful implementation of initiatives that better serve students, staff, and the school.
